SAN FRANCISCO (October 28, 2021) — San Francisco Playhouse (Artistic Director **Bill English**; Producing Director **Susi Damilano**) announced casting for **Twelfth Night**, Shaina Taub and Kwame Kwei-Armah's musical adaptation of William Shakespeare's romantic comedy. The musical will run on the San Francisco Playhouse Mainstage from November 24, 2021 through January 15, 2022. Susi Damilano will direct, with music direction by Dave Dobrusky and choreography by Nicole Helfer.

The cast features **Tasi Alabastro**, **Caleb Haven Draper**, **Amanda Farbstein***, **Sean Fenton***, **Sophia Introna***, **Bear Manescalchi**, **Amanda Le Nguyen**, **Sam Paley**, **Tiana Paulding**, **Jon-David Randle***, **Cathleen Riddley***, **Atticus Shaindlin***, **Loreigna Sinclair***, **Michael Gene Sullivan***, and **Jamie Zee**.

"In the nineteen seasons since we started San Francisco Playhouse, this will be our first Shakespeare play," said Bill English, Artistic Director. "Kwame Kwei-Armah and Shaina Taub have taken the bard's romantic comedy, transformed it into an exhilarating musical, and catapulted it into a moment that is both contemporary and timeless, making it a perfect workout for our Empathy Gym. As the Illyrians so resoundingly sing: 'If we open our hearts to each other's beat, what a better world it could be.'"

Twelfth Night is a rousing contemporary musical adaptation of Shakespeare's classic romantic comedy about mistaken identity and self-discovery. On the twelfth day of Christmas, shipwrecked Viola washes up on the shores of Illyria, disguises herself as a man, is sent to court a countess and falls hard for a Duke. As she navigates the gender confusion in all her roles, she finds her true self and true love in the process. Featuring an original jazz-funk score by Shaina Taub, *Twelfth Night* is a soulful shake-up of a Shakespearean classic.

Twelfth Night was originally commissioned and produced by The Public Theater (Oskar Eustis, Artistic Director; Patrick Willingham, Executive Director). The musical debuted as part of the company's Public Works program in 2016 and was presented as part of the free Shakespeare in the Park program in 2018, where it was met with universal critical acclaim, with Time, The Hollywood Reporter, and The Washington Post naming it one of the best theatrical productions of the year. The San Francisco Playhouse production marks the musical's Bay Area premiere.

About the Creators

Kwame Kwei-Armah is British actor, playwright, director and broadcaster. In 2018 he was made Artistic Director of the Young Vic, where he has directed Twelfth Night and Tree. From 2011 to 2018 he was previously the Artistic Director of Baltimore Center Stage where he directed: Jazz, Marley, One Night in Miami, Amadeus, Dance of the Holy Ghosts, The Mountaintop; An Enemy of the People, The Whipping Man and Things of Dry Hours. Other work as a director includes: Tree (Manchester International Festival), Twelfth Night, Comedy of Errors, Much Ado About Nothing, Detroit'67 (Public Theatre, New York), The Liquid Plain (Signature Theatre, New York and Oregon Shakespeare Festival), Porgy and Bess (Baltimore Symphony Orchestra) the Olivier Nominated One night in Miami for Best New Play 2016 (Donmar Warehouse) and One Love (Birmingham Repertory Theatre). As a playwright his credits include Tree (Manchester International Festival, Young Vic), One Love (Birmingham Repertory Theatre), Beneatha's Place (Baltimore Center Stage) Elmina's Kitchen, Fix Up, Statement of Regret (National Theatre) Let There Be Love and Seize the Day (Tricycle Theatre). Kwame was Artistic Director for the Festival of Black arts and Culture, Senegal, in 2010. He conceived and directed the opening ceremony at Senghor National stadium. He was an Associate Director of the Donmar Warehouse and has served on the boards of the National Theatre, Tricycle Theatre, and Theatre Communications Group. Kwame was the Chancellor of the University of the Arts London from 2010 to 2015, and in 2012 was awarded an OBE for Services to Drama. In 2012, 2013 and 2014 Kwame was named Best Director in City Paper's Best of Baltimore Awards and in 2015 was nominated for the prestigious Stage Directors and Choreographers Zelda Fichandler Award for Best Regional Artistic Director. In 2016 he was awarded the Urban Visionary Award alongside House Representative Elijah Cummings by the Center for Urban Families for his work in the Baltimore community. In 2019 he was the Chair of the Bruntwood Prize for Playwriting. Kwame is a patron of Ballet Black and a visiting fellow of Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford University.

Shaina Taub: Raised in the green mountains of Vermont, Shaina Taub is a New York-based songwriter and performer. She has the won the Jonathan Larson Grant, the Fred Ebb Award and the Billie Burke Ziegfeld Award and has an ongoing concert residency at Joe's Pub. Taub has starred in her musical adaptations of Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night* and *As You Like It* at the Public Theater's Delacorte in Central Park, commissioned for their groundbreaking Public Works initiative. She's currently writing a musical about the American women's suffrage movement and she's writing lyrics for the upcoming musical of *The Devil Wears Prada*, with music by Sir Elton John. Taub's work was featured in Lincoln Center's American Songbook concert series and she recently made her Carnegie Hall debut performing her music with the New York Pops. She wrote songs for and co-starred in Bill Irwin and David Shiner's Old Hats, directed by Tina Landau at the Signature Theatre and A.C.T. She earned a Lucille Lortel Award nomination as Mary in the off-Broadway run of *Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812*, and appeared in the original cast of *Hadestown* at New York Theatre Workshop. Her songs have been performed by Audra McDonald and Sutton Foster, and she wrote the theme song for Julie Andrews' Netflix series Julie's Greenroom, performed by Sara Bareilles.
